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Near Miss

A near miss is:

- An accident waiting to happen
- A lucky escape or close call
- A minor incident / accident which could have been worse

Examples could include:

- Frayed carpet – trip hazard
- Wet floor / icy surface
- Unsafe contractor practices – e.g. tools unattended, work area not cordoned off
- Hot drink spills / collisions
- Broken railing / fencing
- Over-crowding
- Fire exit blocked
- Item falling from height (or high risk of falling)
- Unsafe working at height practice
- Water near a source of electricity

Reporting

Reporting a near miss is extremely important, as the reporting process:

1. Help prevent a re-occurrence
2. Reduce risk of accident / injury
3. Identify any weaknesses in operational procedures
4. Reveal patterns from which lessons can be learned

To report a near miss, the near miss online form should be completed via the [RAISE AP Staff VLE](#). There is the option to report this anomalously if you wish.

This form is sent to the [RAISE AP](#) educational directors who will investigate.

Do not worry that your report may be a waste of time or a criticism. Report all hazards you see and report all close calls you experience or witness.

Near Miss Form

To report a near miss, the near miss online form should be completed via the [RAISE AP Staff VLE](#). There is the option to report this anomalously if you wish.

The near miss form has the following areas:

1. Name of compiler (optional)
 2. Date of incident
 3. Time of incident
 4. Location of incident
 5. Brief description of incident
